- 2.6. evacuate fluids and debris using HVE and/or saliva ejector
- 2.7. identify the structures of the oral cavity
- 2.8. isolate oral cavity
- 2.9. remove the isolation materials
- 2.10. employ safety precautions
- 2.11. maintain infection control protocol
- 2.12. don personal protective equipment
- 2.13. prepare patient with protective equipment

## **Assessment Strategies**

3.1. Clinical Skill Assessment

#### Criteria

- 3.1. review medical history
- 3.2. select the correct armamentarium for dental sealants, coronal polishing and fluoride application
- 3.3. retract the tongue, cheeks and lips using finger, mouth mirror and/or HVE tip
- 3.4. evacuate fluids and debris using HVE and saliva ejector
- 3.5. isolate oral cavity using cotton rolls, dental dam or other absorbent aids (ex. dry-angles)
- 3.6. employ safety precautions
- 3.7. utilize infection control protocol
- 3.8. don personal protective equipment
- 3.9. place appropriate dental sealant
- 3.10. complete a full mouth coronal polish
- 3.11. apply appropriate fluoride or similar dental topical agent
- 3.12. provide pre and post operative instructions to patient
- 3.13. document procedure on patient record

### **Assessment Strategies**

4.1. Clinical Skill Assessment

#### Criteria

- 4.1. review medical history
- 4.2. select the correct armamentarium for amalgam, composite/resin, glass ionomer, temporary restorations, and temporary crowns
- 4.3. retract the tongue, cheeks and lips using finger, mouth mirror and/or HVE tip
- 4.4. suction fluids and debris using HVE and saliva ejector
- 4.5. isolate oral cavity using cotton rolls, dental dam or other absorbent aids (ex. dry-angles)
- 4.6. employ safety precautions
- 4.7. utilize infection control protocol
- 4.8. don personal protective equipment
- 4.9. place, carve, and finish class I, II, and V amalgam restoration on permanent and/or primary teeth
- 4.10. place, cure, and finish class I, II, III, IV, and V composite/resin restoration on permanent and/or primary teeth
- 4.11. place, cure, and finish glass ionomer restoration on permanent and/or primary teeth
- 4.12. place and finish temporary restoration on permanent and/or primary teeth
- 4.13. select, fit and place temporary crown on permanent and/or primary teeth
- 4.14. provide pre and post operative instructions to patient
- 4.15. document procedure on patient record
